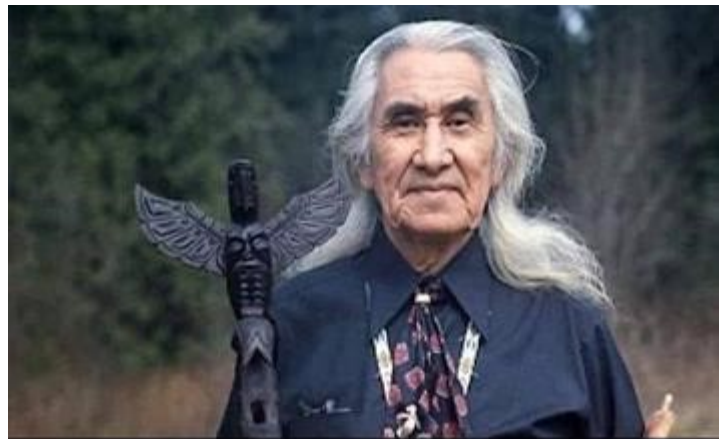

impacts hospitalized older people. It is not a specific disease itself; but is a change in a person's attention, awareness and thinking. It develops over a short period of time and is caused by one or more medical conditions or drugs. Delirium can be very frightening for the affected person and their family and friends. By reducing some of the risk factors that may cause delirium, it may be possible to prevent. became the Kawartha Pine Ridge District School Board. As well as being committed to her students and staff, Dina was a negotiator for our Elementary Teachers Federation.

After retirement in 2001, she volunteered to be on the RTO/ERO Executive. From 2013 - 2020 Dina served as RTO/ERO Foundation Representative for Peterborough District 36. Through our donations, the Foundation investments support the RTO/ERO Chair in Geriatric Medicine and provide grants to support research into the complex needs of Seniors. Dina kept us well informed through her contributions to D36 Newsletters and to Executive Meetings.

She was involved with Friends of Honduran Children and Teachers for Kids. She enjoyed golf, 4th Line Theatre travelling and having fun with friends and, of course, her husband, Dr. Don. Ten Logical Fallacies everyone should know

1. **Ad Hominem**
Occurs when someone attacks directly the person making the argument rather than criticizing the argument itself.
2. **Straw Man**
When someone attacks a distorted version of the original argument that they themselves have created (i.e. “the straw man”)
3. **Appeal to Authority**
Asserting that something must be true because it is backed up by someone who is (allegedly) an authority on the subject.
4. **Slippery Slope**
Taking an argument from the first sensible premise to an undesirable or extreme conclusion via a number of hastily constructed steps.
5. **Bandwagon**
This fallacy occurs when something is said to be true or good simply because it is popular.
6. **Appeal to Ignorance**
When it is said that an argument must be true if it cannot be proven false, or false if it cannot be proven true.
7. **False Dilemma**
Occurs when two choices are presented as the only possible options, when in fact, other alternatives exist.
8. **Hasty Generalization**
Happens when a general conclusion is drawn based on a sample size that is too small.
9. **Red Herring**
Occurs when someone deliberately attempts to move the issue under discussion to a new, irrelevant topic.
10. **Appeal to Tradition**
When one claims that something must be good because it has been practiced for a long time.

Potential Fraud Attempts in Peterborough

... a message from Age Friendly Peterborough

The City of Peterborough is warning residents of a potential fraud attempt after receiving multiple calls from residents reporting that they have been contacted by a business claiming to be contracted by the City to clean sewer lines or address storm water prevention.



The current scam involves several concerning elements:

- asking residents whether they will be home within a certain time period
- coming to residents' doors asking to check their basements and yards
- pressuring residents to sign contracts and pay upwards of \$3,000 under the guise that the government will reimburse them
- showing fake credentials, names and phone numbers
- targeting seniors who have home phone lines

Residents are reminded to never provide personal information to unsolicited callers or people knocking at their door without verifying their identity and the validity of their business.

Know how a fraudster may approach you to protect yourself

It's not a fun topic to talk about, but one we shouldn't

avoid—financial fraud and identity theft. The website **GetSmarterAboutMoney.ca** by the Ontario Securities Commission offers tips and advice to help you recognize fraud and protect yourself. Knowing how a fraudster may approach you is important. Here are some of the ways:

Emails or text messages – a fraudster may pose as someone trustworthy to try to get private information. They may also encourage you to open a link or attachment. If an email seems suspicious, delete it. Don't reply.

Social media – Scammers create fake accounts or take over another person's account. They may also try to form an online relationship with you. Delete connection requests from people you don't know. Review the privacy settings on your accounts.

Phone – Phone scammers may change their caller ID to appear legitimate. They may claim to be from a business or government agency. Avoid doing business over the phone unless you've made the call yourself. If you're not sure, hang up, then call the company back.
